## RDA Alignment with FR Models

- RDA was designed to align with the three conceptual models developed by IFLA
  - Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records (FRBR)
  - Functional Requirements for Authority Data (FRAD) 2009
  - Functional Requirements for Subject Authority Data (FRSAD) 2011

### Consolidation of FR Models

- Differences in the FR models necessitated a reconciliation
- Library Reference Model (LRM) is the result
- LRM approved by IFLA Professional Committee in August 2017

### What Does LRM Mean for RDA?

- Because RDA is based upon the FR conceptual models a change in them necessitates a change in RDA
- 3R Project Goals include alignment with LRM

## What Does LRM Alignment Mean?

- Can have differences that respect the principles of the model
- Expansions of the model
  - RDA Example: Family as a sub-type of Collective Agent
- Omissions from the model
  - RDA Example: Res not in RDA

### Definition of Person

- Merriam-Webster: human, individual
- FRBR: an individual, living or dead
- FRAD: an individual or a persona or identity established or adopted by an individual or group
- RDA: An individual or an identity established by an individual, either alone or in collaboration with one or more other individuals
- LRM: an individual human being

## **Examples of Person**

- Cher, 1946-
- Shakespeare, William, 1564-1616
- Eliot, George, 1819-1880
- Romulus, King of Rome
- Delilah (Biblical figure)

*Note:* LRM allows for human beings who are assumed to have lived

## Non-Human Personage

- Term suggested by Fictitious Entities
   Working Group to describe an individual that is not a human being
- Fictitious character
- Real animal
- Spirit, deity, angel and other nonhuman, non-animal possibly real individuals

## **Examples of Non-Human Personage**

- Koko (Gorilla), 1971-2018
- Michael (Archangel)
- Garland, Judy (Spirit)
- Holmes, Sherlock

*Note:* Does not include groups of unnamed croaking frogs that are recorded


## LRM Approach

- Non-human personages are included in Res because Res is everything
- Res has association with Res
- Res is subject of Work
- Res has appellation Nomen

## How to Approach in RDA?

- Since RDA did not implement Res, LRM approach does not work for RDA
- RDA Entity is all other entities defined in RDA
- Nomen is a designation that refers to an RDA Entity
- Non-human personages are NOT included in RDA Entity
- Non-human personages do not have relationships to Nomen in RDA

## Real-World Cataloging Issues



### **Ground Rules**

- Accept the model
- Instructions for identifying subjects are outside the scope of RDA
- Instructions are not meant for the weirdest book you've ever cataloged (RDA is big enough already)
- Relationships must be accurate to serve users and create good linked data

## RDA Approach

- Nomen is appellation of RDA entity [agent, etc.] of RDA Entity [Agent, etc.]
  - This relationship is only for RDA entities

- Work has subject <?>
- Work has related entity of work <?>
- Agent has related entity of agent <?>

## **Examples of RDA Approach**

- Nomen is appellation of agent of "Cher, 1946-"
  - Works for agents but not NHPs
- Work has subject "Biology"
- Work has subject "Michael (Archangel)"
- Work has related entity of work Koko (Gorilla), 1971-2018

## Implications for LC/NAF

- Name authority records for non-human personages cannot be coded "rda"
- Non-human personages cannot have Agent relationships to Works, Expressions, etc.
- Instructions for identification of nonhuman personages cannot come from RDA or LC-PCC PSs

## Disclaimer

- The following slides present **ideas** for how this may be handled when we begin using the new RDA; LC has made no decisions about this issue
- Only fields and subfields directly related to topic are shown in the MARC examples

### How to Make It Work

- Keep existing NARs in LC/NAF and allow new NARS for individual non-human personages as needed
- Keep fictitious groups and places in LCSH
- New LC manual of instructions for constructing heading for non-human personages
- New MARC description convention source code for 040 \$e and 075 \$2
